Thank you Area 46 for a successful December Assembly. I think we accomplished a lot and my hat's off to you. I'm very happy with the many motions that we passed which utilized a significant amount of the contributions we have received this year. As I have been saying since June, our usual budgeted expenses for 2020 were not going to happen and thus, as contributions continued to arrive, we were going to end the year with about \$20,000 available cash. However, with the motions passed at our assembly we have taken advantage of a great opportunity to update our resources (i.e. website redesign, hy-

brid-meeting set up) as well as fulfill our responsibility to the groups by helping to carry the message.

I'd like to take the opportunity to try and shed a little light on two of our motions that seemed to cause some confusion, if not a little angst. These proposals were the motion to contribute the remaining available cash from the 2020 budget to GSO and the motion to place any excess monies at the close of the books in an allotted fund for special projects. When I first considered these two motions, it appeared to be an either-or situation indicating two uses for the

same funds. However, I remembered that as I was preparing the books prior to the assembly, I discovered that our General Fund available cash was \$3,581 greater than our budget available cash. Turns out, this is exactly the amount of assembly hosting funds, a 2019 expense, that have been returned to us. As I explained in my August *El Farolito* report, these funds were placed in non-budget income and therefore are not included in the end of the year budget available cash. This occurrence is certainly an

District 11 – NW ALBUQUERQUE

Welcome 2021 and warm greetings to you all from District 11. We meet the second Saturday from 9:00-10:00 a.m. on Zoom with the anticipation that we will eventually be able to return to hybrid and then, oh happy day, face to face sometime. We have a few chair positions open: archives, accessibilities, cooperation with the professional community/public information (CPC/PI), literature, and treatment.

We are considering the possibility of a permanent Zoom meeting for District 11. The conversation is just beginning. There are a lot of details to

work out. It would take commitment, coordination, Zoom volunteers, a revolving chair. I will keep you posted as this unfolds.

At the December Assembly the Ad Hoc Committee About the Books updated us on their work. They are considering the option to distribute the books proportionately among the Districts. District 11, with 19 groups, represents 5.57% of the Area. If selected, we would receive 198 books: 95 Twelve & Twelve (hardback), 53 Twelve & Twelve (soft cover), 44 Big Book, 4 Experience, Strength and Hope, 1 Came

to Believe, and 1 Twelve & Twelve (pocket). The Committee asked us to consider the question: Can we distribute these books? Yes, we can.

A new book will soon be available. A Visual History of Alcoholics Anonymous was originally developed as a souvenir book for the 2020 International Convention that, sadly, was cancelled. It is an illustrated tour through AA history and a celebration of our fellowship. It will be published January 14 and can be purchased from Central Office or the Grapevine.

Accessibilities & Remote Communities

We opened our committee meeting at 10:55 a.m. with the Serenity Prayer. About 10 people attended the meeting, with representation from six districts.

Jaclyn S., District 12, gave an update on the pamphlet they have put together to help make AA more accessible in their area. Previously, their emphasis had been more on seniors in need. But, with the ongoing restrictions and new technology being used, they have expanded their focus to be more inclusive of anyone, anywhere having access to the various meetings now available. And, specifically for seniors living in care facilities, they are also in the process of setting up a group of volunteers to be "senior sponsors". They don't sponsor them in the normal sense of the word, but they will help them set

up and get accustomed to their electronic devices so that they can more easily log into an online meeting. It's a great project!

Likewise, District 6, has been busy updating their pamphlet to include all the new Zoom meetings. They included an email contact and it is receiving inquiries and is quickly putting people in contact with AA.

Our Delegate, Bill L., was also present. Bill currently serves on the Treatment and Accessibilities Committees for the General Services Conference. He gave us an update on his work with both committees. The Accessibilities Workbook is currently being updated to include new language. He encouraged anyone who had suggestions for the accessibilities workbook, get that information to him right away so that he will have

it before the January board meeting.

The remainder of our time focused on a special project to make the Area 46 assemblies, conventions, and planning meetings more accessible to everyone wishing to participate by purchasing a hybrid meeting setup. Our Area Treasurer, Christoph, was present and had already researched some of the requirements and costs. Those were discussed in depth and a motion was brought forth that was presented on Sunday morning.

We ended the meeting with the Responsibility Statement at 11:45.

Ad Hoc Committee About the Books

"These books came from the world. We want to get them back out to the world."

Hello from AHCAB. I want to take this article to share a consideration coming from our committee which might be a little different than what your district may have thought about the 6,000 books we received from MDC 20 months ago.

It is clear now that the books came to us "from the world," meaning that an organization, a county corrections department outside of AA, thought they were important enough to buy in bulk to distribute to alcoholics still suffering. The 6,000 are the remainder of a load of thousands of more books initially purchased by that department. As we intercepted their trip to the dump, our AA Traditions tell us that we might best keep with their initial purpose: to carry the message to the alcoholic who still suffers. How do we do that?

Well, it is possible that a district might think the best way to do this is to have the books available for free at their meetings (when we have meetings again). But to quote from Bill W. in AA Comes of Age, pg 82, "...alcoholism is a quest for survival in which the good is sometimes the enemy of the best, and that only the best can bring the true good."

What about the alcoholic who hasn't yet found herself in our meetings? Is there a family member of an alcoholic out there who needs to read our instructions on how to contact AA? How would he find us?

Your district may have members who cannot afford books. But if there are sponsors who can buy a book for a newcomer, doesn't that better support GSO and AA as a whole than giving out free books which could go to someone who hasn't yet found us?

Does your District have a jail, li-

braries, parole offices, union halls, corner book boxes for free book exchange, a hospital or clinic or Mexican consulate, a book van, a Goodwill store, a homeless shelter or foodbank? Might the books find alcoholics who suffer in places you haven't yet imagined? Could these books save lives? Area Committees for CPC, PI, Corrections, Treatment and Bridging the Gap are here to help you just for the asking.

These are the questions we want to put before the Area before we reconvene in March. What are your thoughts? How might your Higher Power fire your collective imagination? Let us know!

Greetings from Taos! Grateful to have participated in the Area 46 Assembly that took place on December 5-6. We had 17 AA members participate in the Area 46 Cooperation with the Professional Community (CPC) Committee. Lawrence with the assistance of Janet A. provided an overview of the purpose of the CPC Committees at the district level.

Lawrence asked for ideas on how to better distribute AA literature in efforts to forward the suggestions to the Area 46 Ad Hoc Committee About the Books. Recommendations for distribution were to libraries, hospitals, colleges, Department of Corrections, Spanish and non-Spanish centers, rural and frontier areas

such as Navajo Nation. It was also suggested that districts can distribute the AA literature. GSO Staff Member, Diana L. sent an email stating that Grapevine is looking for CPC stories: "Have you participated in CPC service (providing doctors, therapists, clergy, lawyers, teachers, parole officers and other professionals information about AA)? Did a professional help you find your way to AA because of CPC service work? Are you a professional who found out about AA from members doing CPC work? We are looking for stories of your experiences, anywhere from 300 to 1800 words. To submit your story, go to www.aagrapevine.org/share. Stories are due April 15, 2021."

There are many opportunities for CPC Committees at the District level to carrying the message to professionals and the suffering alcoholics, especially during the pandemic crisis we are experiencing such as emailing out AA online Zoom meeting schedules and providing local Districts' phone hotlines.

My motion to the Area to provide up to \$350 to purchase postage-paid envelopes was approved and I was very excited. However, since the Assembly I received the GSO of AA Corrections Activity Update letter. In their letter they state: "Currently the waiting list has been fulfilled. Since

the pandemic we have a substantial reserve of outside male / female correspondents; we will continue to welcome male / female volunteers, but we inform them that there may be a wait of several months before they can be linked with inmates." So, the purchase of envelopes won't be necessary until summer. I still encourage anyone who is interested in being a correspondent with an inmate to go ahead and complete and submit the Corrections Correspondent Sign-Up Form found on the aa.org website.

In the meantime, I'm going to implement the AA Meeting Card idea I spoke about last month with the

plan to distribute them into parole and probation offices, but I'm going to need your help, please. If you are a group or district Corrections chair, please contact me via email (corrections@nm-aa.org) and provide your name, phone number, group Name or district number and I'll make every effort to get some AA Meeting Cards to you including the basic instructions for completing and distributing the cards. Thank you for your assistance in helping me get this started.

Debra K. has accepted the position of *El Farolito* committee chair for the 2021-2022 rotation. Debra has been working at the Albuquerque Central Office for several years, she knows Area 46 very well and will be a great asset for this publication. Debra stood for disapproval during the recent December Assembly and will officially take over the editor reins around March 31. In the meantime, I will serve as Interim Editor until Debra can take over as editor as she transitions out of her position at Central Office. Congratulations to Debra!

The *El Farolito* committee met during the assembly and discussed a number of other current business items. I presented the most recent financial information available which showed a bank balance of \$1,231.15 as of October 31, 2020. When adding in group contributions received in November, along with November expenses, the approximate *El Farolito* funds balance as of December 5 was \$1,731.15.

El Farolito is funded almost entirely through group contributions, along with paid subscriptions, and

the available funds in our account has been about one-and-one-half times our monthly expenses on average this past year. As always, continued group contributions of any amount are always welcome, appreciated and needed to continue publication of *El Farolito* every month.

With Debra's upcoming transition to editor in the coming months, we'll be looking to move the printing of *El Farolito* to the Albuquerque-Santa Fe area, as the issue's mailing permit requires monthly mailing out of the Albuquerque central post office business mailing unit. While the editor was located in Taos, getting the newsletter produced in Taos was most practical. We'll also be transitioning to a new post office box located in the Albuquerque area and this new address will be published in the coming weeks.

During the assembly meeting the committee discussed the need for groups or individual volunteers to help prepare the *El Farolito* issues for mailing. Groups can volunteer to hold mailing parties where a small group of members meet for about 90

minutes to a couple of hours, to help tape up, stamp and sort the printed ELFs for mailing. Until we can routinely meet in groups, the committee is looking for individual volunteers or member households in the Albuquerque-Santa Fe area to take batches of the printed ELFs, prep them to mail, and then have them ready to be picked up to be taken to the post office. This service work would start in late January.
